

SHOOTING SPORT

1. GENERAL TERMS

The Shooting Sport event shall be organised in accordance with the most recent technical rules of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) unless otherwise stated by FISU. In the event of a disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text shall be regarded as authoritative.

The programme and duration of competitions are fixed by FISU in agreement with the Organising Committee and the CTI WUC. The competitions shall last minimum five (5) days and include the following events:

Rifle discipline

Events for Men

10m Air Rifle Men (60 shots)

50m Rifle 3 Positions Men (3x40 shots)

Events for Women

10m Air Rifle Women (60 shots)

50m Rifle 3 Positions Women (3x40 shots)

Mixed Team Air Rifle

Pistol discipline

Events for Men

10m Air Pistol Men (60 shots)

25m Rapid Fire Pistol Men (60 shots)

Events for Women

10m Air Pistol Women (60 shots)

25m Pistol Women (30 + 30 shots)

Mixed Team Air Pistol

Shotgun discipline

Events for Men

Skeet Men (125 Target)

Trap Men (125 Target)

Events for Women

Skeet Women (125 Target)

Trap Women (125 Target)

Mixed Team Trap

Each country may enter a maximum of thirty-nine (39) persons: thirty-three (33) competitors and six (6) officials.

Individual Events

Rifle discipline

Events for Men, Women: A maximum of five (5) competitors per discipline but no more than three (3) competitors in each particular event.

Pistol discipline

Events for Men: A maximum of seven (7) competitors per discipline but no more than three (3) competitors per discipline in each particular event;

Events for Women: A maximum of four (4) competitors but no more than three (3) competitors per discipline in each particular event.

Shotgun discipline

Events for Men: A maximum of six (6) competitors per discipline but no more than three (3) competitors in each particular event;

Events for Women: A maximum of six (6) competitors per discipline but no more than three (3) competitors in each particular event.

Team Events

Three (3) competitors per team and country in each particular event.

Two (2) competitors per Mixed Team and country in each particular Mixed event/Air Pistol, Air Rifle and Trap.

At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors accredited by the CIC.

The team composition shall be confirmed at the General Technical Meeting or at the latest 48 hours before the discipline starts.

2. PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Three (3) months before the Championship, the Organising Committee has the right to collect 25% of the total cost of stay per athlete and official from participating countries.

Format of competition

Qualification rounds: The events shall be completed in individual as well as team. In the 50m events, if entries exceed the expected number, elimination rounds shall be conducted.

Final rounds: All the Olympic events shall be conducted as finals. The eight highest-scoring shooters in the qualification rounds of rifle and pistol individual events shall qualify for the finals. For the Rapid Fire Pistol men's event and the shotgun event, the six highest-scoring shooters shall qualify for the final.

The non-Olympic events shall be conducted without the final rounds.

Team events shall be ranked from the results list of the preliminary rounds / elimination or qualification.

Shooters have to mention in the entry forms in which discipline of the events they will participate: individual event, team event, or both.

3. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Nomination and costs

The ITOs shall be appointed jointly by the ISSF and FISU. The Organising Committee shall bear their cost of board and lodging (from two (2) days before the opening ceremony to one (1) day after the closing ceremony). Their travel cost and per diem shall be divided among the participants.

Other costs are referenced in the FISU – ISSF partnership agreement.
