

ROLLER SPORTS

1. GENERAL TERMS

The Roller Sports events shall be organised in accordance with the technical regulations of the Federation Internationale de Roller Sports (FIRS). In any dispute the English text shall be regarded as authoritative.

The programme and duration of competitions shall be fixed by the FISU Executive Committee in agreement with the Organising Committee and the CTI. In principle, the programme shall last a maximum of seven (7) days and include the following distances:

For the track:

300 m time-trial race
500 m sprint tournament
1.000 m sprint tournament
10.000 m points + elimination race
15.000 m elimination race
3.000 m relays

For the road:

Marathon

Each country may enter a maximum twenty (20) persons: sixteen (16) competitors (eight (8) men and eight (8) women) and four (4) officials.

Each country may enter per gender category:

Men: two (2) athletes for each distance may start in races

Ladies: two (2) athletes for each distance may start in races

For the marathon, additional athletes per country may start in the race according to FISU TD decision based on the number of participating countries.

At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors accredited by the CIC.

2. PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Three (3) months before the Championship, the Organising Committee has the right to collect 25% of the total cost of stay per athlete and official from participating countries.

The procedures regarding the draw shall follow the FIRS technical regulations.

3. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

3.1 Nomination and costs

ITO's shall be appointed jointly by FIRS and FISU. Their costs (travel, per diem and full board) will be covered by the FIRS.

Other costs are referenced in the FISU – FIRS collaboration convention.

3.2 Number of Technical Officials needed

The number of officials needed shall respect FIRS rules.

The OC in cooperation with their National Roller Federation must provide the guarantee the sufficient number of Judges for the races and for all the competition days.

Based on the FIRS rules it is necessary to have eight (8) International Judges appointed from FIRS CIC Chairman 30 days before the competition (chapter 2 and 3 of the FIRS CIC regulations).
